

#### St Anthony's Fete and P&F Meeting this Wednesday Night

Thank you to our wonderful and generous sponsors who have supported our fete again in 2017. We are looking for ways to acknowledge your organisations and honour our commitments. We will be in touch again soon.

Thank you to the members of the broader community who support our annual fete. We are sorry that the Fete didn't go ahead this year, but we hope to have to back bigger in 2018.

The fete raffle was drawn on Saturday at midday, congratulations to the three lucky winners. The raffle makes up a good proportion of the fete profits, so that's a source of fundraising for the P&F to build upon in 2017.

#### 2018 Enrolments

The official Catholic Education enrolment period closed on Friday. This gives us the chance to check the number of enrolment forms received for the Early Learning Centre, Kindergarten and other year levels. We will also follow up outstanding applications. It appears from initial checks that our enrolment numbers are promising for 2018. If you know of any parent with an outstanding application have them contact our school or ELC office as soon as possible.

Starting this Monday, I will have quite a number of days that I have devoted to 2018 ELC and Kindergarten interviews. This process will take a couple of weeks. Enrolment cross-check meetings are coming up soon with other school principals and then acceptances for places are offered on 21 June.

#### Funding – Stop the proposed cuts

On Friday I attended a meeting of Archdiocesan Principals, Clergy and Catholic Education leaders to discuss the Australian Government's proposed cuts to Catholic schools funding. Catholic Education Director Ross Fox and Archbishop Christopher Prowse spoke and were resolute in leading the stand to address this issue. Catholic Education's key objections to the proposed funding policy/model remain consistent:

- The policy will require significant fee increases in Catholic schools in the ACT.
- The legislation increases the expected fee in every Catholic primary school across Australia to allow Catholic schools to reach the Schooling Resource Standard set by the Government.
- Concerns on the needs-basis in the model are shared by Government departments and public schools across the country.
- Catholic education holds significant concerns on the flawed data on Students with Disability that has been adopted in the new model.

This proposed GONSKI 2.0 funding model is **not good** for all schools. It is **not good** for all students. The funding model is **not equitable.** It **does not meet the needs of students in Catholic schools**. It is **not fair** funding for all students.

Catholic Education supports needs based funding and fair funding for all Australian school students BUT the proposed funding model will greatly affect students in Systemic Catholic Schools, particularly those in ACT Systemic Catholic Primary Schools.

At the heart of the tradition of Catholic Education and its mission is to educate and support the poorest and most vulnerable students and families in our society. This is under threat if the purpose of Catholic Schools is not understood and recognised by Governments at all levels.

**Catholic schools must be able to continue** their proud tradition of 158 years of service and education in Australia. **Catholic schools provide low fee, accessible, inclusive schooling** to those parents seeking this form of education for their child.

The Government's proposed policy is due to be presented to the Senate for approval on 20 June so we have less than one month to speak up!
