

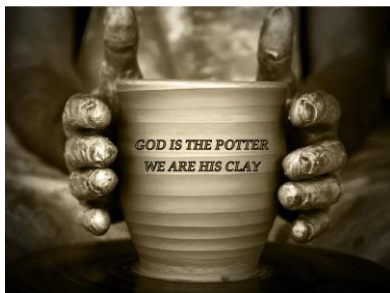

### St Anthony's hosts ROCKIT Cyberbullying Workshops this Wednesday

On Wednesday Chris Taylor, Regional Manager from Telstra, visited the school to introduce the ROCKIT Cyberbullying program and workshops. ROCKIT student workshops were held in the school hall for students from Year 3 to Year 6. The presenters were young and savvy digital technology users and they were able to relate well with students. They led discussions on the importance of using digital technologies and the internet safely and productively. Technology plays a big part in most students lives and the key is education. In many ways digital inclusion equals social inclusion for students.

The ROCKIT team made a lively presentation including key tips for online safety. They focussed on empowering the bystanders in cyberbullying, those who witness comments and put downs. They provided strategies for all students to be part of the solution and not part of the problem.

Telstra are digital ambassadors to fight against bullying and St Anthony's was proud to host this first series of workshops in ACT. Channel Nine also attended the session and spoke with Telstra staff, teachers and students. These workshops are a good lead into the National Day Against Bullying next Friday 16 March.

## 2018 Catholic Leaders' System Day and Retreat

As you know, last week I spent 3 days with key Catholic leaders including principals, CE staff and Monsignor John Woods. Our Director, Mr Ross Fox, and other CE leaders presented on the first day and shared information on the development of the new CE strategic plan. We discussed how this strategic plan was moving forward and what it may mean for our school communities. CE is still in the phase of working with stakeholders to define the detail of the proposed changes. It is very clear though that Mr Fox is placing student learning at the forefront of our initiatives and he is committed to supporting schools to be aspirational and a High Performing.

The two-day retreat component centred around the theme of Understanding Jesus, Understanding Judaism. Our facilitator was Peta Goldberg from the Australian Catholic University. We worked through the INQUIRY model of the World BEHIND the text, the world OF THE text, the world IN FRONT of the text.

Peta is an outstanding presenter, world renowned for her work. It was very interesting looking into Jesus' life as a Jewish child/man and how this influenced his paradigm, relationships and actions. We immersed ourselves in the New Testament, with some reflections on the lineage of key biblical figures and the prophecy of the old testament. Then we reflected on what various texts said to us as individuals and what difference will each text make in my life.

We finished with a lovely Mass as a group, led by Monsignor John Woods, who is the Episcopal Vicar for Education in our archdiocese. Due to the expanse of our archdiocese, Key Catholic leaders only get together 3 times each year. It was very uplifting to be together and then take back some ideas to our individual school communities.

## Maths Partnership 'Local Schools' Project

St Anthony's teachers are part of a 2018 Maths partnership with Holy Family, St Mary MacKillop College and Catholic Education. Yesterday we welcomed teachers from these schools and our Year 3 teachers taught lessons which were observed by the team. The project involves an ongoing professional conversation between this team of teachers about best practice and the research underpinning the pedagogy. Paul Kruger, a Maths consultant with Catholic Education, will facilitate the project and work actively with each school community for 2018. This is an exciting partnership between key educators in our region of Tuggeranong to strive for the best outcomes for students in Mathematics.

## STEM Week (Week 7)

STEM Week is a new focus for the school, building on previous science week and other activities. STEM Week is Week 7 this term. A very exciting plan has been organised for the week involving all students from ELC to Year 6. A program for the week will be shared with the community shortly outlining how students can get involved. Thank you to Mrs Monique Egan, the STEM staff team and the STEM student leadership group for promoting STEM Week and this area of learning.

This Friday afternoon Year One students will lead our first Focus Assembly of 2018. You are all most welcome to attend.

Are you a parent or carer that is keen to promote physical health and wellbeing at St Anthony's?

Are you available on weekday mornings from 8:00-8:30am?

Would you be keen to plan and run a short, half an hour fitness session for our students?

If you have answered yes to the questions above, then St Anthony's needs you!!!

As part of our wellbeing focus this year, we would like to run a Fitness Club for students before school.

Research shows that:

- *Physical activity and sports are generally promoted for their positive effect on children's physical health; regular participation in physical activity in childhood is associated with a decreased cardiovascular risk in youth and adulthood.*
- *There is also a growing body of literature suggesting that physical activity has beneficial effects on several mental health outcomes, including health-related quality of life and better mood states.*
- *In addition... there is a strong belief that regular participation in physical activity is linked to enhancement of brain function and cognition, thereby positively influencing academic performance.*
